E-Conveyance Devices



E-Bikes

E-bikes are classified by three different classes. All have fully operable pedals & an electric motor of less than 750 watts.



E-Scooters

E-Scooters are two or three-wheeled devices that have handlebars, a floorboard that is designed to be stood upon when riding and is powered by an electric motor and human propulsion.



E-Skateboards

E-Skateboards are devices that have a floorboard and are designed to be stood upon when riding and powered by an electric motor and human propulsion.

Although there are no age restrictions for electric bicycles that operate up to 20 mph, the Consumer Products Safety Commission recommends that children between the ages of 9 and 12 should not operate any product that travels faster than 10 mph.

Street Legal E-Bikes

Class 1 – equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and stops when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Under 18 **MUST** wear helmet.

Class 2 – equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Under 18 **MUST** wear helmet.

Class 3 – equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and stops when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour and is equipped with a speedometer.

ALL ages **MUST** wear a helmet. **MUST** be 16 or older to operate

All E-Conveyances users must obey ALL Traffic Laws and City Ordinances.

E-Off Road Motor Driven Cycle

Not Street Legal

IE: Sur-Rons

- Reaches Speeds up to 40-60 MPH.
- Not Equipped with Bike Pedals**
- Can be Impounded for a Minimum of 48 Hours (21721(a) CVC)
- Unlicensed Operator (Must have M1 or M2 endorsement) can be cited
- A DOT approved helmet is required for operator and passenger(s)



Requirements for street use:

- Add proper side mirrors
- Add turn signals
- Add a functional headlight and taillight
- Must be inspected at a local DMV to confirm they meet all requirements of the CA vehicle code
- Once approved by the DMV, they are issued a license plate, and the license must always be visible
- The unit must be registered, and the registration needs to be paid annually like a motor vehicle or motorcycle
- Riders must be 16 years or older, and have a valid CA driver's license, and an M1 or M2 endorsement
- Riders must wear a CA-DOT approved helmet.
